Landscape Design (with blueprints)	Landscape design is the art of arranging the features of an area of land for aesthetic and/or practical reasons. It is often divided into two major components: hardscape (the nonliving elements, such as pavers) and softscape (the living elements, such as flowers). A foodscape is a subset of a softscape and can include hardscape elements. The foodscape arranges the features of an area to provide higher-quality food products at a cheaper cost.
Material and Product Sourcing	This is the identification and items (including tools) needed within the landscape and those who supply those items. This encompasses all landscape supplies and all types of plants.
Pick up and Delivery	This service assists the DIY'er by providing an easy and cost-effective way to get materials and products to the site, reducing personal labor and transportation concerns.
